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# ACTIVE FINNISH INSTITUTIONS IN TWINNING AND TAIEX

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## FINNISH PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

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The Finnish public administration is cost-efficient, effective, and accountable. According to the World Bank's Worldwide Governance Indicators, Government Effectiveness is the best in Finland among the EU Member States. Government effectiveness captures perceptions of the quality of the public service, its degree of independence from political pressures, the quality of policy formulation and implementation, and the credibility of the government's commitment to such policies. Finland is also on the top regarding modernisation of public governance including eGovernment services, performance-based management and budgeting, as well as regulatory impact assessments promoting strategic thinking.

Highly competent and skilled civil service increases the cost-effectiveness and accountability in administration. High emphasis has been put to develop specific structures, mechanisms, and practices to strengthen horizontal cooperation at all levels of public administration. The openness and transparency are strengths that help not just in giving out information and building trust, but also in disseminating information and expertise within public administration.

The Finnish Government has a strong track record in managing difficult economic situations. Adjustments of public administration have proven to be a success factor both in supporting Finland's remarkable transformation from an economy specialised in traditional industries to a diversified and modern economy and in helping the country to navigate through economic crisis. As a result, the Finnish citizens today trust the public administration as a key partner for economic development and service delivery, as well as the mechanism to realise many Finnish values of social solidarity and equality.

The values of state administration are built on the value base of a democratic constitutional state and a Nordic welfare society within globalising environment. In international comparisons, Finland has been deemed to be a country with very little corruption. High ethical standards of state administration have been achieved by adopting Government's shared values and uniform operational culture.

Finland's public administration is keen to offer its innovation-driven and knowledge-based expertise and solutions to Twinning projects and TAIEX activities.

## FINNISH CUSTOMS

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**Finnish Customs is a modern, efficient customs agency with high-level standards for integrity and professionalism. Finnish Customs is a state agency supervised by the Ministry of Finance, and it is a part of the customs system of the European Union. Being an executive authority, Finnish Customs has responsibilities that extend to the sphere of authority not only of the Ministry of Finance but also of several other ministries.**

Finnish Customs cooperates with the trade community as well as with domestic and foreign authorities. Finnish Customs has approximately 300 employees. In 2013, the total tax revenue collected by Customs amounted to 10.3 billion euros.

### Finnish Customs

- facilitates smooth trade of goods and ensures its correctness
- collects taxes on goods efficiently
- offers customer-oriented services
- protects society, the environment, and citizens

Protecting society is a key element in the work of Customs. By law, Finnish Customs is responsible, among other things, for controlling imported consumer goods as well as non-animal foods. At Finnish Customs, it is the Customs Laboratory that examines the compliance and safety of products. The Customs Laboratory also performs analytics concerning illegal imports, customs duties, and taxation for Customs. In practice, it is an authority laboratory and competence centre for many sectors.

Finnish Customs is an important operator within the EU and in the World Customs Organization, as well as a central operator in facilitating the economic cooperation between the EU and Russia. Finnish Customs participates in the work of the World Customs Organization (WCO), and took part in the work of the NGTF at the WTO, when the TF Agreement was prepared and negotiated.

Customs cooperation between the Nordic countries is also close and successful. The administrative cooperation with the other neighbouring areas - Russia and the Baltic countries - is also very significant. Finnish Customs has a diversified experience of international co-operation and of cross-border activities at all sectors related to customs and co-operation within authorities.

**Founded in 1865, Statistics Finland is the only Finnish public authority specifically established for statistics. It produces the vast majority of Finnish official statistics and is a significant international actor in the field of statistics. The task of the Statistics Finland is to combine data into statistics and information services for the needs of ordinary people, public administration and scientific research. Statistics Finland supports democratic decision-making based on facts, as well as scientific research by producing reliable statistics, studies and datasets describing society. The Statistics Finland employs some 900 experts in a variety of fields.**

Eurostat's Peer Review Report in 2014 found the statistics production of Statistics Finland to be of high quality and reliable. The impartiality of statistics producers and people's trust in statistics are regarded as particular strengths for Finland. The Peer Review Report praises the broad co-operation of the producers of official statistics and the extensive use of registers, which brings cost-efficiency to the work of statistics producers. International peer reviewers consider Statistics Finland's Survey Laboratory particularly innovative in developing interview methods and questionnaires for surveys.

**The Finnish Tax Administration (FTA) is an independent authority under the Ministry of Finance, implementing tax legislation set out by the ministry. The FTA is a modern tax administration which continuously works to develop and streamline its administrative processes. In this work, the strong competence of FTA staff and the management's ability to fully draw on their expertise is essential.**

The Tax Administration wants to ensure that its customers pay the right amount of taxes at the right time, and works continuously to keep the tax gap small. The FTA aims at making sure that its customers can and want to manage their tax affairs smoothly and correctly. Efficient tax control and genuinely customer-oriented services help to reinforce tax compliance. Tax compliance is further enhanced by fair treatment of taxpayers, just and lawful distribution of the tax burden, and streamlined user-friendly procedures.

Combating the grey economy is a vital goal for the FTA. The Grey Economy Information Unit fights the grey economy and its side effects by producing and disseminating information. The Unit's annual publications sum up the results of the studies made during the year and present the latest methods for fighting the grey economy.

FTA experts participate actively in international co-operation. They have taken part in various EU Fiscalis and IOTA (Intra-European Organisation of Tax Administration) projects, workshops, seminars and other international activities. FTA experts have also offered consultancy as well as planned and executed training programmes. Most of the FTA

experts have wide experience of working in multicultural teams and of project coordination and management.

EU candidate countries and new EU member states have received assistance from FTA experts in various development projects. The Twinning projects in Slovakia, “Improvement of Tax Collection System and Related Policies” and in Estonia, “Structural and Quality Amelioration of the Criminal Investigation, Tax Collection, Recovery, Audit and Training Function within the Estonian Tax Board”, helped to improve taxation related systems in both countries. In addition to the Estonian and Slovakian Twinning projects, the FTA has implemented Twinning projects as a leading partner in Hungary. Moreover, the FTA has provided experts to pre-accession Twinning projects in Lithuania and Croatia.

THL Centre for International Affairs offers consulting services, specialising in health and social sector development. The team is well experienced to plan, implement, monitor, and evaluate development processes and programmes in transition economies and developing countries. The Centre emphasises in its work human rights, sustainability and participatory approach. Through the use of its expert services, the team has been involved in over 150 projects in 50 countries worldwide. ## FMI – FINNISH METEOROLOGICAL INSTITUTE

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**The Finnish Meteorological Institute (FMI) is a research and service agency under the Ministry of Transport and Communications. The working areas of FMI are meteorology, climatology, geophysics, air quality and climate change. The Finnish Meteorological Institute provides meteorological and physical oceanography services, gathers and maintains reliable information about the atmosphere and physical condition of the seas and about their influence, and does research. Today some 730 people are working at FMI of which 53% are dedicated to research and development.**

The FMI has a very strong Research Unit, publishing more than 350 international peer reviewed research articles in 2014, making FMI one of the leading NMS in Europe for research. The focus areas of FMI's research include climate, climate change, meteorology, marine, and measurements and modelling the composition of the atmosphere (including greenhouse gases, aerosols, and air quality), remote sensing (incl. satellites and weather radar), and space.

In addition to being a leading expert in several research areas, Finnish Meteorological Institute is also committed to help other countries, especially the developing world, in the development of their meteorological services. FMI is also an important participant in several international organisations and projects. Experts from practically all units of the FMI take part in FMI's international projects.

The Finnish Meteorological Institute can rely on a solid background in organising and delivering international training in meteorology. FMI has

been for more than a decade responsible for leading the EUMETNET EIG training programme for planning, assisting, and delivering courses in meteorology for operational personnel across Europe in association with other European Meteorological Services.

FMI is the appointed expert organisation on air quality issues in Finland providing research and services with expertise covering a wide range of air quality activities. FMI has carried out numerous international capacity building projects concentrating on strengthening the air quality management in different countries. In international development and training projects, FMI offers technical training on air quality related topics, such as air quality measurements and assessments, air quality related legislation development, dispersion modelling, chemical analyses of air quality, etc.

The evaluations aim to develop education and to support learning while ensuring the quality of education. The evaluations also produce information for local, regional, and national decision-makers on education, its developments, and international comparisons. Evaluation activities of Finnish Higher Education Evaluation Council (FINHEEC), Finnish Education Evaluation Council, and the National Board of Education merged to form the FINEEC in 2014.**

FINEEC's evaluation work is professional and independent, and its evaluation methods are broadly accepted in the field of higher education both nationally and internationally, which was also reported by an international expert panel that reviewed FINHEEC's evaluation work and methods in 2010. The key operating principles of FINEEC are independence of evaluation and enhancement-led evaluation. The overall number of staff is approximately 40.

FINEEC also organises training related to evaluation and quality assurance, supports benchmarking, actively disseminates information about evaluation outcomes, promotes research on evaluation, gives statements and cooperates internationally.

FINEEC is tasked with engaging in international co-operation in higher education evaluation. FINEEC is an active contributor to European evaluation policy debate and closely monitors general European higher education policy and the creation of the European Higher Education Area. FINEEC collaborates with other national evaluation organisations, participates in the activities of several international forums, and is involved in international evaluation projects. FINEEC is listed on the European Quality Assurance Register for Higher Education (EQAR) and is a full member of the European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ENQA).

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**The Police University College is Finland’s only police training institution, a centre of expertise in police training, research and development. The Police University College is a training institution under the direction of the Ministry of the Interior. It is responsible for police education recruitment and selection of students, for organising all educational programs, for further in-service training, and for research and development in the fields of police, policing, and security.**

The University College provides degree education on Bachelor and Master levels, as well as broad programme of further education courses for law enforcement personnel. Its duties also include law enforcement related research, development, and innovation. The University College also organises graduate courses. After having achieved Bachelor's degree, a police officer is able to apply for Police Sergeant Diploma studies or to the Master's Programme for commanding officers. The Police University College also provides several Police Specialist Study programmes offering eligibility for a variety of specialised tasks within the Police, such as forensic investigation, cybercrime investigation, drug-related crime investigation, police-dog operations, and road policing.

The Police University College also offers training for persons and organisations outside the police. For instance, the college organises studies for emergency call center administration and courses for security steward instructors as well as different kinds of courses related to security for enterprises.

Research at the Police University College is focused on e.g. police work, policing, and wider security environment. The research information is applied, for example, in developing security in society and predicting changes to policing. The Police University College implements research projects together with universities and research institutes. Research cooperation also extends to public sector, businesses, and the third sector.

Police University College has a proven track record of successful capacity building for governmental bodies in training and research and development projects in EU pre-accession and neighbourhood policy countries. ## THE FINNISH BORDER GUARD

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**The Finnish Border Guard is an internal security agency operating under the Ministry of the Interior. The Border Guard is a cooperative, internationally renowned expert in border management and maritime safety, an authority that increases the safety and security of people and ensures fluent border crossings. The main duties of the Border Guard are to control Finland's borders on land and at sea, carry out border checks on persons at land border crossing points, ports and airports, and perform search and rescue operations, particularly at sea. The Border Guard also performs police duties, and implements customs controls at border crossing points where the Finnish Customs is not present.**

Finnish Border Guard employs approximately 2700 persons. The Border Guard bases its activities on the values of competence, reliability, and cooperation.

The Border Guard is responsible for six core functions:

1. border surveillance
2. border checks
3. crime prevention
4. maritime safety
5. international cooperation
6. national defense

The Finnish Border Guard liaises on a constant basis with the relevant authorities of neighbouring countries, EU Member States, Schengen countries, and countries applying for EU membership.

The Finnish Border Guard cooperates closely with the European Agency for the Management of Operational Cooperation at the External Borders (FRONTEX) and participates in EU and OSCE civilian crisis management operations. Practical cooperation with the Russian Border Guard Service are dealt with by regional border delegates.

In its work The Finnish Border Guard implements and promotes European Union's Integrated Border Management (IBM) standards.
