Employment pensions service is also rendered by the mployment pensions institutions, the insurance ompanies and their local offices, by the local representatives of the Farmers' Social Insurance Institution and the local offices of the Social Insurance Institution.


If the end of 1993, 1.2 million people drew a pension in iniliand and total pension expenditure amounted to FIM 0.0 thousand million, thereby accounting for 38.8% of ocial security expenditure. The private-sector beneficiries numbered 913,000 and pension expenditure mounted to FIM 28.3 thousand million.






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

Population aged 15-64 by activity, 1993, %






Population insured for employment pension benefits














Private-sector employment pension expenditure, 1993





verage overall pension of old-age, disability or nemployment pensioners in the private sector at ear-end, 1993




